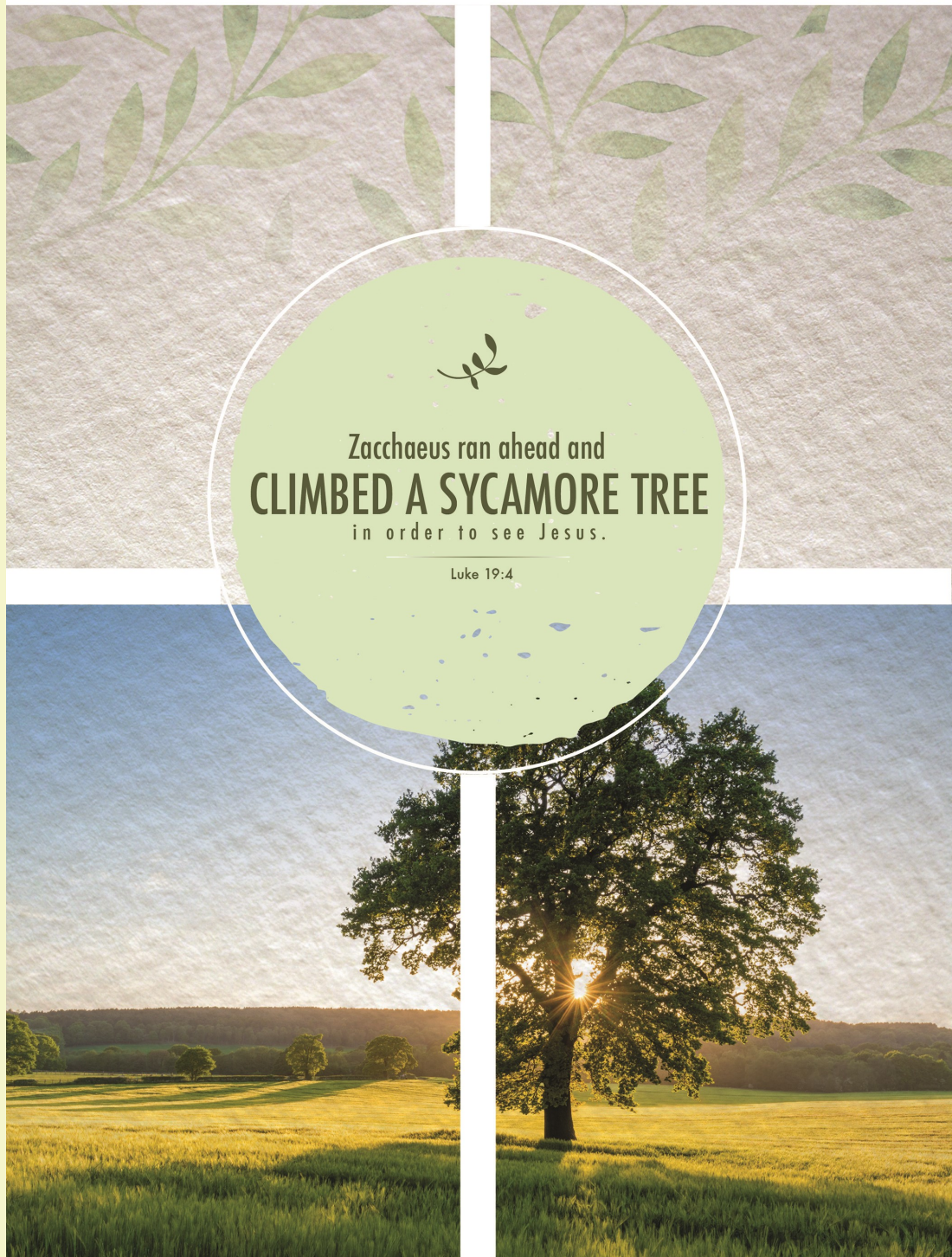

My dear family of St. Pius X and St. Leonard,

These glorious Fall days have been healing for the soul, and I hope that life has provided you with some opportunity to take advantage of a walk outdoors to enjoy the magnificent colors! Fall also forms the backdrop for the Church's November custom of remembering the dead and praying for the Holy Souls in Purgatory. All Saints Day and All Souls Day reveal to us our glorious destiny and the path required to get there. For me, both celebrations are so imbued with hope and inspire me to strive for a more authentic Christian life!

They are also two of the first major celebrations that we have the opportunity to experience as a united parish. I sincerely hope that you'll set aside time on the November 1 Holy Day to attend Mass and aspire to the Kingdom to which the saints have led the way. November 2 is a moving night where the shared experience of loss and remembrance has a profound effect on the soul.

One of the things that I so appreciate about these celebrations is their ability to transcend cultures and languages. A tear shed over the death of a loved one is the same in any language, and the importance of being together as one family during these times supersedes even the value of experiencing Mass exclusively in one's own language. For that reason, our main celebrations at all these special Masses during the year are bilingual. It is a necessary compromise that helps us to stand together in the same faith even when there is a language barrier to overcome.

As someone who has worked very hard to pray in two languages, I have often thought that it would be helpful to share some of the pointers that have helped to shape my own spirituality of a bilingual liturgy. I readily own that praying in two languages can be clumsy and is rarely anyone's preference. But I have also found that it can express the universality of our faith in a way that is truly awe-inspiring, and I often carry away from a bilingual Mass unexpected treasures that are different from the ones I would notice in a typical Sunday Mass. And so these are the things that might draw your attention:

The Mass, like the Church, is universal. Praying in a language that wasn't my own actually gave me the important reminder that my Catholic faith is so much bigger and broader than I had ever imagined. It reawakens in me a missionary spirit that is part of Christ's great commission to preach to all nations! And ironically, even when I don't know where I'm at in Mass, I seem to know exactly where I'm at in Mass. The gestures and rhythm of a Mass transcend culture and language because the Mass is heavenly worship, not earthly. I remember my surprise at my first World Youth Day when I was able to figure out the moment of consecration, the Lord's Prayer, and the Lamb of God, despite never having taken a German class or a French Class. It struck me that the Mass, even in a different language, was just so... Catholic!!!

Participating in a bilingual Mass is an act of generosity. Naturally, I attend Mass hoping that I will "get something out of it." And the Lord always delivers on His promise that He has prepared for us the feast of Heaven and Earth! But hearing someone else's language at Mass causes me to notice my neighbor who is also together with me at Mass, and who is here with me because they also crave the Eucharist; and I can recognize that each of us will most naturally relate to God in our Mother Tongue. And so, sharing fragments of the Mass in different languages allows us both to share in the scraps that fall from the Master's table!

Hearing another language at Mass can be a tool for reminding me that **the Mass is still a mystery**, and I will never fully comprehend the depths of what miracles God is working on that altar. An occasional bilingual liturgy can save me from becoming overly familiar with the Mass. This is perhaps the same argument that makes the Latin liturgy appeal to so many committed Catholics of my generation: there is something about the Mass that I will never quite fully grasp.

Bilingual/"Spanglish" Mass actually does carry a certain appeal for our young people, particularly first-generation young adult Catholics. It somehow naturally bridges their experience of preferring a Spanish Mass because it carries the ethos of their upbringing, and yet more easily understanding the complexities of Scripture and preaching in the comfortable English of their education.

As we gather for some of these shared liturgies through November and December, I hope that these points will help you enter into the Mass more fully, rather than being distracted by or begrudging of a second language. Bilingual Mass cards in the pews can also help you to follow along, and sometimes even learn a response or two in another language. Above all, we grow together in Charity as the Lord teaches us His grace!

Let's pray for one another!

Mi querida familia de San Pío X y San Leonardo,

Estos gloriosos días de otoño han sido buenos para el alma. Espero que la vida les haya brindado la oportunidad de dar un paseo al aire libre para disfrutar los magníficos colores de la estación. El otoño también forma el telón de fondo de la costumbre de la Iglesia en recordar a nuestros fieles difuntos y orar por las Almas del Purgatorio en este mes de noviembre. El Día de Todos los Santos y el Día de los Fieles Difuntos nos revelan nuestro glorioso destino y el camino requerido para llegar a él. ¡Para mí, ambas celebraciones están llenas de esperanza y me inspiran a seguir luchando por una vida cristiana más auténtica!

Éstas son dos de las primeras celebraciones importantes que tenemos la oportunidad de vivir como parroquia unida. Espero sinceramente que el Día Santo del 1 de noviembre dediquen tiempo para asistir a Misa y aspirar al Reino al que los santos han abierto el camino. El 2 de noviembre es una noche conmovedora donde la experiencia compartida por la pérdida de seres queridos y su recuerdo tiene un efecto profundo en el alma.

Una de las cosas que más aprecio de estas celebraciones es su capacidad para trascender culturas e idiomas. Una lágrima derramada por la muerte de un ser querido es la misma en cualquier idioma, y la importancia de estar juntos como una familia durante estos tiempos supera incluso el valor de experimentar la Misa exclusivamente en el propio idioma. Por esa razón, nuestras celebraciones principales en todas estas Misas especiales durante el año son bilingües. Es un compromiso necesario que nos ayuda a estar juntos en la misma fe, incluso cuando hay que superar la barrera del idioma.

Como alguien que ha trabajado muy duro para orar en dos idiomas, a menudo he pensado que sería útil compartir algunos de los consejos que me han ayudado a dar forma a mi propia espiritualidad de una liturgia bilingüe. Reconozco fácilmente que orar en dos idiomas puede ser un reto y rara vez es la preferencia de alguien. Pero también descubrí que puede expresar la universalidad de nuestra fe de una manera que es verdaderamente impresionante, y a menudo me llevo de una misa bilingüe tesoros inesperados que son diferentes a los de una típica misa dominical. Las siguientes son cosas que nos pueden llamar la atención:

La Misa, así como la Iglesia, es universal. Orar en un idioma que no es el mío es realmente un importante recordatorio de que mi fe católica es mucho más amplia de lo que jamás había imaginado. ¡Resurge en mí un espíritu misionero que es parte de la gran comisión de Cristo de predicar a todas las naciones! Irónicamente, cuando no sé dónde estoy en la Misa, me parece saber exactamente dónde me encuentro en la Misa. Los gestos y el ritmo de una Misa trascienden la cultura y el idioma porque la Misa es adoración celestial, no terrenal. Recuerdo mi sorpresa en mi primera Jornada Mundial de la Juventud cuando pude descifrar el momento de la consagración, el Padrenuestro y el Cordero de Dios, a pesar de nunca haber tomado una clase de alemán o una clase de francés. Me llamó la atención que la misa, incluso es un idioma diferente, era tan... ¡católica!

Participar en una Misa bilingüe es un acto de generosidad. Naturalmente, asisto a misa con la esperanza de "aprovechar algo de ella". ¡Y el Señor siempre cumple su promesa de que nos ha preparado la fiesta del Cielo y de la Tierra! Pero escuchar el idioma de otra persona en la Misa me hace notar a alguien más que también está conmigo en la Misa, y que está aquí porque también anhela la Eucaristía; puedo reconocer que cada uno de nosotros se relaciona más naturalmente con Dios en nuestra lengua materna. ¡Pero, compartir fragmentos de la Misa en diferentes idiomas nos permite a ambos compartir lo que cae de la mesa del Maestro!

Escuchar otro idioma en la Misa puede ser una herramienta para recordarnos que **la Misa sigue siendo un misterio.** Nunca comprenderemos completamente la profundidad de los milagros que Dios está obrando en el altar. Una liturgia bilingüe ocasional puede ayudar a no familiarizarme demasiado con la Misa. Este es quizás el mismo argumento que hace que la liturgia latina atraiga a tantos católicos comprometidos de mi generación: hay algo en la Misa que nunca entenderemos del todo.

La Misa bilingüe/"Spanglish" en realidad tiene cierto atractivo para nuestros jóvenes, particularmente para los jóvenes adultos católicos de primera generación. De alguna manera, les une naturalmente a su experiencia de preferir una misa en español porque contiene el espíritu de su educación, sin embargo, ellos comprenden más fácilmente las complejidades de las Escrituras y la predicación en el cómodo inglés de su educación.

A medida que nos reunamos para algunas de estas liturgias compartidas durante noviembre y diciembre, espero que estos puntos les ayude a participar más plenamente en la Misa, en lugar de distraerse o tener resentimientos por un segundo idioma. Las tarjetas de misas bilingües en las bancas pueden ayudarles a seguir las lecturas y ocasionalmente, a aprender una respuesta o dos en otro idioma. ¡Sobre todo, nos ayuda a crecer juntos en la caridad como el Señor nos ha encomendado! **¡Oremos los unos por los otros!**

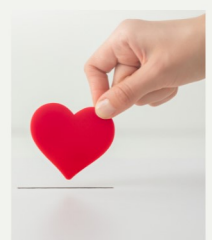

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The sudden and unexpected influx of men, women and children seeking asylum to U.S cities, including Chicago, over recent weeks has presented our community with significant challenges but also significant opportunities to share God's message of compassion and joy. The plight of these asylum seekers, most of whom are fleeing violence, political oppression and crushing poverty in their home countries causes us grave concern, but I am convinced that this is a moment for us to join together in a mission of love and mercy.


Over 3,000 asylum seekers arrived in our city as of mid-October. Almost all the migrants we have welcomed report that they plan to stay in the Chicago area and will need support to reestablish their lives. Unlike other migrants, most do not have relatives in the States with whom they can live and learn as they build new lives.

The Catholic community has shown an outpouring of compassion as churches, religious congregations, and other ministries have opened their doors, and Catholic Charities has deployed a team to connect people with loved ones and conduct initial needs assessments. Across the Church, many parishes have responded, and more help is needed. We have mobilized to create a coordinated Catholic response to assist asylum seekers so we might maximize the impact of our assistance as we bear witness to our faith. A Working Group has gathered to evaluate opportunities to serve. We are considering several options including transitional shelter, parish sponsorships, and pastoral care for asylum seekers.

In support of these efforts, parishes throughout the Archdiocese will hold a second collection for asylum seekers at all Masses celebrated the weekend of November 5-6. The commitment of faithful Catholics like you will help ensure the success of this mission. Please consider giving to this collection or giving directly to Catholic Charities which will serve as a central gathering point for donations.
