My dear parish family,

Can you believe that we're already halfway through September?! School years are up and running, faith formation programs are about to begin, and the work of unifying our parish marches ever onwards. I do apologize that there sometimes are not enough hours in the week to get a letter into the bulletin. I will certainly make a more concerted effort to better utilize this vehicle of communication to keep you up to speed!

A few weeks ago, I started to reflect on the idea of developing a "spirituality of communion," a phrase made popular by the Servant of God Chiara Lubich and also by St. John Paul II. Ultimately, a spirituality of communion is at the heart of how we are called to approach our lives and destinies as Christians, and also how we ought to approach the evangelizing work of the Church. I believe that it also forms the backbone of a healthy integration of our two communities to become one united parish.

I don't think we can overemphasize the importance of the word "Communion" in Catholic spirituality. Obviously, it is the shorthand way that we refer to our reception of the Eucharist every Sunday, but that shorthand expression conveys a profound reality - holiness is quite simply living our lives in total union with God. Communion, that shared union between persons, is at the essence of God's very nature as Trinity. Every Sunday in the Creed we profess one God in three divine persons, coequal and consubstantial, sharing all things in a dynamic relationship of love. The unity of the Trinity then superabounds into all of creation where everything is drawn together into a delicate but perfect harmony. As human beings, we are meant to live a double communion - with God, and with our neighbor. What we receive in Holy Communion (God's very self united perfectly to us) is actually the very goal and purpose of our whole life, and the Eucharist provides us with the very power that we need in order to then live out our relationships with others as an expression of that communion that we share with God.

In order to awaken this sense of communion, both Lubich and St. John Paul II saw as an essential first step a profound experience of God's immense and personal love. Though he was always a devout kid, John Paul discovered God's love in a deeply personal way after the deaths of his mother and father and his awareness of being completely dependent at all times on the providential care of God our Father. Lubich discovered the immense love of God through reading the Gospels together with a group of her peers and striving together to live its high ideals. Both figures were so captivated by the love of God that their lives became radically reoriented toward living in constant and perpetual relationship with Him.

Inviting each one of our members to discover in a deep and personal way God's immense love for us is the number one pastoral priority of the newly combined parish of St. Pius X and St. Leonard. As we work through the practical processes of adjusting job responsibilities, office schedules, policies and procedures, and discerning Mass times and a parish name, the WORK of the parish must always revolve around this first priority of creating space for encountering God's personal love. Every group in the parish and every ministry is always ordered toward that end.

Some opportunities that already exist to facilitate that goal:

- **Weekly Eucharistic Adoration at the St. Leonard campus all day Friday, and First Friday Holy Hour at St. Pius campus**
- **Ample opportunities for reconciliation at both sites.**
- **Morning and evening daily mass times to encourage more frequent reception of the Eucharist.**
- **Alpha programs in English and in Spanish at St. Pius X campus to reawaken our experience of God's love.**
- **Christian Foundations Class as a space for growing in knowledge of God**
- **A family-based religious education program to assist the entire family in becoming the first school of communion for their children.**
- **Seminars through Comunidades Maria Mediadora aimed at healing and removing obstacles to experiencing God's love.**

- Band of Brothers, Choice Wine, Iskali, CCW, Knights of Columbus, Holy Name Society, y el Grupo Juvenil, creando comunidades pequeñas de fe en donde uno se siente apoyado en su encuentro con Dios.
- La escuela de San Leonardo como un lugar en donde nuestros alumnos pueden poner en práctica su fe y animarse a la oración y el encuentro con Dios.
- Grupos del Rosario y Grupo Guadalupanos que nos ayudan a conocer el cuidado y la protección especial que nos ofrece Nuestra Madre en nuestro camino con Dios.

Mientras que continuamos nuestros esfuerzos, esas oportunidades van a continuar y crecer. La lista no es completa, pero reconozcan que la misión siempre es la misma: no podemos crecer como comunidad en una espiritualidad de comunión se no hemos tenido una experiencia de la comunión que experimentamos en el inmenso y personal amor de Dios. Ora para que siempre mantengamos esa prioridad en nuestras mentes y nuestros corazones, y que yo sea un pastor capaz de ayudarnos a vivirla!

IT'S GO TIME!!! RACE DAY IS OCTOBER 9!

Fr. Bobby is running the Chicago Marathon!!! I know it's as crazy as it sounds, but I've been training for the last three months and pushing myself completely beyond my comfort zone in order to help raise funds and awareness for the Mission of Our Lady of the Angels in West Humboldt Park. I've been connected to OLA almost from the beginning (my grandma actually went to school there during the time of the tragic school fire). I've watched as this beautiful ministry was reborn from the ashes of despair, encouraged the new Franciscans in their formation as sisters and brothers, celebrated Mass with them and now for them, and worked alongside them in service to their neighbors on the near West Side. The Mission of Our Lady of the Angels is a true Chicago Miracle, and it's a privilege to continue to support them in their work. OLA currently supports approximately 3000 families with a number of different services ranging from food pantry and community dinners to senior programs and youth mentorship in a part of the city that is so often only in the news because of violence. If you have a soft spot for nuns who are changing the world, or for non-runners who made themselves into runners in order to help OLA finish the race in their fundraising efforts, you are welcome to support them with a small donation. 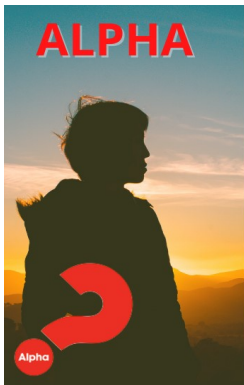

Changes are hard....

....but God's love will get us through it!



We wanted to use this section to keep our parishioners informed of some of the progress being made in the unification efforts here at St. Pius X and St. Leonard. I will highlight some of these things in greater detail through announcements and conversations at Mass, as well as in future bulletin articles. We hope that it is helpful to you in knowing where we're at in the process!

Office and Facilities Updates

- Relatively soon, we will begin intentionally working to transition to one unified office on the St. Leonard Campus. We anticipate this necessary step will help to streamline communication among all staff members and serve as a central hub of information about our parish. Already, the multiple office sites have caused a few blips in scheduling and other related questions. We know that bringing our staff under one roof will greatly increase collaboration and streamline our work. Over the last year, St. Leonard used some money from insurance-related repairs, as well as some savings to make vital repairs and renovations to the convent on the south end of our campus. This building is now updated to serve as a parish office for the newly united parish, as well as a parish center with plenty of additional larger and smaller meeting rooms to support parish life. As we wrap up this initial phase of construction and the building becomes usable, the combined St. Pius and St. Leonard offices will find their new home here. To still make essential office services accessible at St. Pius campus, we will schedule remote office hours in the St. Pius vestibule to coincide with weekend Masses when the majority of the community is already gathered anyway. We hope this adequately addresses any challenges that might be faced by those who have limited mobility or other concerns about making the trip up to the office on 34th and Clarence. Of course, our friendly office staff is also always willing to help handle concerns via telephone or email!
- We are also in the process of finalizing a procedure for the reservation of facilities at both sites and for calendar approval. With the explosion of programs and ministries that now results from bringing our two parishes together, we want to be strategic about how to make sure parishioners from both campuses are encouraged to participate in the various groups and events of our parish. This also involves carefully coordinating to avoid duplication of events, competition between events, or double-booking rooms. The short summary of the policy is to keep Magaly Alvarez (malvarez@stleonard.org) abreast of all space requests, as she has now become the calendar queen for St. Pius X and St. Leonard.

Discernment regarding the Mass Schedule

- In the bulletin today (and also available in print copies at the back of church and in the vestibule), we are launching a new survey to help our team begin the discernment of a new Mass Schedule. This is an opportunity for me to solicit feedback from you before the unification team begins conversations about future mass times and locations. It will help us to get a sense of perceived needs and attitudes, as well as a better understanding of the willingness of our parish to collaborate and compromise so that we can most effectively offer a Mass Schedule that fits the needs of our whole community. While I don't anticipate making any final changes until November, we'd like to begin to get the conversation started. The survey will be open for two weeks and we ask for as much participation as we can get. Please note, we know that no one EVER likes to change their Mass schedule! But the long-term needs of the parish and the ability of our team to adequately provide quality pastoral care will demand that we make adjustments. Keep in mind the great gift that the Eucharist is to our lives of faith, as well as the privilege it is to know that the Lord has taken up residence in our communities. In countries where people must go to great lengths and often at great personal risk in order to receive the Eucharist, we ought to consider our mild inconvenience of shifting times or locations as a small sacrifice that we can offer back to the Lord, and pray for an increase of vocations from our parish!

Mi querida familia parroquial,

¿Puedes creer que ya hemos pasado más de la mitad del Septiembre? El año escolar ya va en marcha y los programas de educación religiosa ya están por comenzar, y el trabajo de unificar nuestra parroquia sigue adelante. Pido disculpas por no tener suficientes horas para poder siempre escribir algo para el boletín. Haré un esfuerzo para mejor usar este modo de comunicación para mantenerlos al corriente.

Hace unas semanas, empecé a reflexionar sobre la idea de cultivar una “espiritualidad de comunión.” Era una frase popularizada por la Sierva de Dios Chiara Lubich y también por San Juan Pablo II. Una espiritualidad de comunión debe de formar el corazón de cómo somos llamados a vivir nuestras vidas y nuestros destinos como cristianos, y también cómo debemos manejar el trabajo evangelizadora de la iglesia. Creo que también forma el pilar de nuestra integración sana de nuestras dos comunidades haciéndose una sola parroquia.

No creo que podemos enfatizar demasiado la importancia de la palabra “Comunión” en la espiritualidad católica. Obviamente, es la palabra que usamos para hablar de la recepción de la Eucaristía cada Domingo, pero esa palabra también comunica una realidad profunda - la santidad es precisamente vivir nuestras vidas en una unión total con Dios. La comunión, esa unión compartida entre personas, es la esencia de la naturaleza de Dios como Trinidad. Cada Domingo en el credo, profesamos que creemos en un solo Dios, tres personas divinas, coigualesy consubstancial, todos existiendo en una relación dinámica del amor. La unidad de la Trinidad sobreabunda en toda la creación en donde todo existe junto en una armonía delicada pero perfecta. Como seres humanos, vivimos en una doble comunión - con Dios, y con nuestro vecino. Lo que recibimos en la santa comunión (Dios mismo, unido perfectamente a nosotros) es actualmente la meta y el propósito de nuestra vida entera, y la eucaristía nos provee con el poder actual que necesitamos para poder vivir nuestra relación con los demás como una expresión de esa comunión que compartimos con Dios.

Para despertar ese sentido de comunión, ambos Lubich y San Juan Pablo II veían como un paso esencial tener una experiencia profunda del amor inmenso y personal de Dios para ellos. Aunque siempre era un niño devoto, Juan Pablo descubrió el amor de Dios en una forma muy personal cuando fallecieron su papá y su mamá y tuvo que aprender el cuidado providente de Dios Padre. Lubich lo descubrió a través de leer los evangelios junta con un grupo de sus amigas y luchando juntas para vivir según sus ideales tan altas. Ambos fueron tan cautivados por el amor de Dios que sus vidas se hicieron radicalmente reorientadas hacia él y decidieron vivir todos sus días en una relación constante y perpetua con él.

Una prioridad pastoral para nuestra nueva parroquia de San Pío X y San Leonardo es invitar a cada miembro a que experimenten y descubran de una forma profunda y personal el amor inmenso de Dios para nosotros. Mientras que trabajamos con los detalles prácticos de unir la parroquia, ajustando responsabilidades del trabajo, discerniendo horarios para las oficinas y las misas, las pólizas y los procedimientos de la parroquia, etc... el TRABAJO de la parroquia siempre tiene que girar alrededor de esa prioridad de crear el espacio para encontrarse con el amor personal de Dios. Cada grupo en la parroquia y cada ministerio siempre tiene ese propósito.


Algunas oportunidades que ya existen para facilitar esa meta:

- **Adoración Eucarística cada viernes en San Leonardo, y la hora santa cada primer viernes del mes en San Pío.**
- **Oportunidades para confesarse en ambos lugares.**
- **Misa diaria por la mañana y por la tarde para animarnos a comulgar más frecuentemente.**
- **Sesiones de Alpha en inglés y español en San Pío para despertarnos al amor de Dios.**
- **Clase de Christian Foundations como un espacio para crecer en nuestro conocimiento de Dios.**
- **Educación Religiosa para toda la familia para ayudarles a las familias a formarse como una escuela de comunión para sus hijos.**
- **Programa de SPRED para facilitar el encuentro con Dios para nuestros amigos con necesidades especiales (y a menudo también a descubrir a través de ellos nuestro propio encuentro con Dios).**

A LETTER FROM FR. BOBBY

- SPRED program to intentionally facilitate the encounter with God for our friends with special needs (and often times to discover through them our own deepening encounter with God).
- Band of Brothers, Choice Wine, Iskali, CCW, Knights of Columbus, Holy Name Society, and Youth groups fostering small faith communities where encountering God can be actively encouraged.
- St. Leonard School as a supportive learning environment where students are regularly encouraged through prayer and action to encounter God.
- Rosary Groups and Guadalupanos helping us to know the special care and protection that Our Lady offers us on our journey to God.


As we continue to unite our efforts, these opportunities will only continue to grow and expand. The list, of course, is by no means exhaustive, but know that the mission is always the same: we do not know how to grow in a spirituality of communion without first experiencing the beautiful communion of God's immense love in a personal way. Pray that we might always keep this priority at the forefront of our minds and hearts, and that I may capably continue to shepherd us into it!

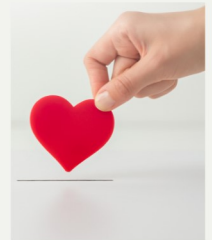
